A Message from the SENDCo, Mr. Bray:

Hello everyone. November has been a very busy month for us. On a person note, I have started my National Award for Special Educational Needs Coordinators (NASENCO), which is a qualification SENDCO's have to do when they start the role for the first time. I have also been working with several parents this month to support them with diagnosis process and have been filling out forms that go towards helping some of our children to get additional support in school. The referral process is particularly taking a long-time across Leicestershire at the moment, but if you have any questions please let me know about this. Take care.

75% of parents know who the SENDCo is and how to contact them.

Mr. Bray (Year 5 Teacher) is the school SENDCo. In the first instance, please contact your child's class teacher, then any concerns afterwards need to be brought to the SENDCo's attention.

November's theme is... Sensory Spaces

What is a Sensory Space?

A sensory space is a designated area within a school which can support children's needs. It is a space which aims to provide children with ways to self-regulate their emotions. In other words, ways for them to think about their learning behaviours. The aim of this is to better prepare them for learning and interacting with others.



The Studio and Learning Lounge – the studio and learning lounge are our Sensory Space in school. Children who need 'time out' or 'brain breaks may use this space. This is something we are looking to develop in the future.

What you can try at home:

Time Out Zone – some children need a space to 'time out'. At home, this is most likely to be their bedroom. Somewhere that is a safe space for them to go to when they need time to themselves. Consider making the room dark or using lava lamps, to create a calm, peaceful environment. If you have any questions about how you can do this at home, please get in touch with Mr Bray.
