Dear Parents/ Carers

We hope you had a lovely half term holiday.

Welcome to the Lent 2 term. Isn't it lovely that the daylight hours are getting longer and Spring will soon arrive., so we can start to make more use of outdoor learning? We've also had great fun talking about the planet's alignment in the night sky this week. The children and staff have continued to work on the theme of Hope for the Jubilee and will continue to do this in Lent which begins next Wednesday. We warmly invite families to join with us at the 9.15 mass on Wednesday the 5th of March at St Mary's church for Ash Wednesday. Families are also very welcome to join us for our Monday and Thursday celebrations of the word, at 9a.m in the hall, which are planned around a weekly focus. This week on the theme of belonging, one of the pupil chaplaincy team on the Thursday assembly is teaching the school about Sikhism and in a couple of week's time, the children in their RE lessons will focus on Hinduism in their RE lessons for the week. The school was gifted some money by the Loughborough Catenians for the Catholic life and mission of the school. The outdoor stations of the cross that you can see on the junior playground and the catholic life board in the hall were purchased.

Refurbishment Junior playground and roofing

Our Academy has received a grant to work on the school roofing at St Mary's, clearing the moss, securing the skylights and the roof tiles. This work will be extensive over the Summer holidays. I appreciate your understanding about the condition of the junior playground, but you must be as I am concerned about children tripping on the loose gravel. In our continued partnership with St Mary's parish, we do need to let the cars park on the playgrounds in the weekend for the masses, but this causes further damage. I requested last term a site survey and a health and safety survey on the junior playground- this was completed in the February half term and the Academy agreed it needed resurfacing. How ever due to the work on the roof in the summer, there will be large vehicles on the playground, which is why the academy wants to delay the resurfacing until after that. I appreciate a suggestion from some parents, that until the resurfacing, one afternoon in March, families get together to sweep it and see how we can make it safer; please look out on class dojo for a date and time. Any help will be gratefully appreciated. Until then, I will keep risk assessing the playground and request for it to be resurfaced sooner.

Please do ensure you have access to class dojo and are getting the messages/ newsletters on the school story page, class story and messages. Most of the communication will be completed this way to reduce paper and printing costs. Thank you.

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Personal Development Curriculum

The key aims of our personal development curriculum are to support pupils to become responsible, confident, healthy, and tolerant young adults who are prepared for life and work in an ever changing world. At St Mary's we deliver a holistic curriculum for life. The PDC curriculum is an ambitious and sequential curriculum. It is an age appropriate curriculum based around three core themes – Living in the wider world, health and wellbeing and relationships. The PDC curriculum focuses on both knowledge, characteristics and virtues.

Each class has a set of Characteristics that they work on, such as resilience, patience, empathy or encouragement. This is also linked to a Gospel Virtue, which is shown on a round circle outside of the classrooms- which are love, faith, wisdom, courage to name a few. Each class also has a Catholic social teaching action and symbol which they work on through the year. This is highlighted in weekly Liturgies linked to scripture. Pupils have half termly time to work in houses and on their Catholic social teaching action and virtue.

Our curriculum includes development of pupils' understanding of religious education, citizenship, equality and diversity, healthy living, British Values- such as democracy in parliament week, and preparing our pupils for their next stage. This is taught through timetabled lessons, is threaded throughout the wider curriculum and through personal development themed days, such as safer internet day, diversity day and the upcoming career's day.

As well as the weekly Liturgies which focuses on moral and spiritual development and keeping safe assemblies and visitors, we have weekly Personal, Social and Health Education lessons. We have had lots of visitors in to help us with this- such as the local PCSO's, school nurses, the air ambulance and the Litter wombles. We teach the children about road safety, water safety and safety at specific events, such as bonfire night.



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Leicestershire Children's Holidays and Trips/Colour Dash

Leicestershire children's holidays are a great charity that we fundraised last year for on the colour dash. They have helped us so much to fund school trips, such as the year 2 and 5 space centre trip, the Briar's residential and other trips for pupils in receipt of pupil premium funding. Without their support, we would not be able to fund so many trips for the year and reduce parent contributions. The St Mary's colour dash this year, will be on Friday the 2nd of May, which we will aim like last year to run on Cumberland field. We do hope you can support this year, as every child benefits in St Mary's school from this charity. The children will have an assembly on this on the 8th of April at 9a.m. Families would be welcome to join us in the school hall for this assembly.

Careers Day

<u>SEND</u>

Friday the 14th of March- after the 9a.m achievement assembly

_We warmly welcome parents to a SEND meeting on the above date and time in the school hall to find out more about SEND provision and the Leicestershire SEND hub/ PINS project. Leicestershire is part of the Leicester City, Leicestershire and Rutland local area partnership who are collectively taking part in the national Change Programme Partnership for SEND and Alternative Provision reforms. The Change Programme Partnership was launched by the Department for Education (DfE) in September 2023 to test and deliver reforms to SEND and Alternative Provision with a small group of local area partnerships. Leicestershire is also an early adopter for the Partnerships for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) program (now also part of CPP) and has commenced engagement with a selection of local primary schools to test models of support to enable neurodivergent children and young people to remain in mainstream education. St Mary's is participating in the PINS project, with the School Senco Mrs Rutledge at the helm. We are continually working on making St Mary's more inclusive for pupils with SEND and will aim to provide you with more information this year and to enable visits to school to see the provision for children with SEND needs.
