Key Questions: - How do I hide anything unsettling I see whilst I report it to a trusted adult? - How can I find information on the internet? - What is a search engine? - What is a key word search? - How can I store my work on the computer to come back to it later? 										
Key Skills: - To locate age appropriate websites through a favourites menu and/or by typing a website (URL) into the address bar in a web browser. - To use search engines to find specific information or resources. - To use key words to search a specific resource for information - To name, save and store work in an appropriate place and be able to retrieve, amend and print it. - To select appropriate images to add to work and add different forms of media together in a word processing document (e.g. text and images) - To know how to minimise the screen, turn off the computer screen or use back buttons to go back to the home screen if anything inappropriate appears on the screen.
